


If we don't recycle phosphorus safely from waste water and from waste food soon we eventually go hungry

Phosphorus is now mined from Rock







Figure 2: Global sources of phospharus fertilizer. Since the mid-1940s, population growth accompanied by greater food demand and urbanization have led to a dramatic increase in the use of mined phosphare rock compared with other sources of phosphorus. Source: Cordell et al. (2009)




The Remaining Countries with Phosphorus Rock



Peak phosphorus curve











Phosphorous rock is a limited resource and will eventually be depleated.

Separating human urine from domestic waste water is necessary so that the phosphorous can be recycled sustainably to grow garden crops


Food Price inflation is Unavoidable

- Because Phosphorus Rock is Finite
- The Resource continues to be wasted
